Session 1: Constructed Stormwater Wetlands in the Adelaide Region Paul Green

Paul Green's session will identify the structure, function and distribution of key urban wetlands. It will also provide resources on using them for class and individual fieldwork.

What is 'community' and why is it important to consider when looking at environmental management ? Dr Jonathan Sobels will explore how the use of this word and concept relate to participation in natural resources management using the Land Action Planning Groups of the Murray Darling basin as a case study.
